
# EDITING OPTIONS FOR YOUR WEDDING VIDEO

When it comes to your wedding video, the first thing you should make sure you are getting is edit options. Your video should come with at least one free edit, that way, if you don't like the first draft you can change it at no additional cost and not just leave it up to chance. If your video comes with one free edit you are going to want to check how much each edit is after that. If it doesn't come with any free edits, it is important to find out how much any edits to the film are. Edits can be expensive, so this is important to research when choosing who you're going to do your video services with.





# RAW WEDDING FOOTAGE




Another thing you should check for when booking your video package is what length of video you are receiving and if it comes with the RAW footage. RAW footage is the entire unedited raw film of the entire day. This isn't footage that you would want to sit and watch with your family like a highlight video would, but it still allows you to see the entire day if you ever wanted to look back on it. Lengths of video's often include 3-5 minute highlights and 30-60 minute highlights. It is important to know which of these you are getting so that you are not overpaying.



# WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN BOOKING YOUR VIDEOGRAPHER




Another thing to consider when it comes to your wedding video is the hours that you are booking your videographer for. For video, you should be checking if the coverage is consecutive or per event. Consecutive means that the videographer will be there filming for a specific amount of hours regardless of how long the day goes. The video provided will not be equal to the amount of hours that they were booked because of editing and highlight lengths.



# WAYS TO RECIEVE YOUR WEDDING VIDEO

Lastly, make sure that you find out what type of delivery options you are getting. Ask if you are receiving the footage on a USB, DVD, Digital Download or a combination of any of the options.
